# Methodology

Magellan Strategies and Keating Research are pleased to present the topline results of a survey of 800 registered voters in the State of Colorado. The results include 400 respondents contacted by text-to-online and 400 through an online panel.

The interviews were conducted from December 4<sup>th</sup> - 9<sup>th</sup>, 2024. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.46% at the 95 percent confidence interval.

The survey data were weighted to be representative of Colorado's voter registration demographics.





## 3-of-4 voters want the state to invest in solutions to streamline Medicaid access

Medicaid provides health care for low-income children and adults in Colorado, but administrative barriers—such as lost re-enrollment packets, application delays, and complex enrollment requirements—have led to the largest Medicaid enrollment decline in the U.S. This has resulted in healthcare providers going unpaid and patients losing access to care. Should the state prioritize investing in solutions to streamline Medicaid access, ensuring eligible residents can receive the health care they need?




#### Covered by Health Insurance



#### Parent of a Child Under 18?


