## Colorado May Pay More For School Lunch Programs

Colorado is considering spending \$1 million on local  $\underline{school}$   $\underline{\sigma}$  lunch programs.

Wednesday, a grant program is up for vote in a house of committee. It would make Colorado the 17th state to chip in grant money to help get locally grown foods on cafeteria plates.

Colorado started a farm-to-school project in 2010, but the program hasn't paid farmers to help put their food in <u>schools</u>  $\overline{\mathbb{Z}}$ .

Bill sponsors call the grant the next step for the program.
