

# Magellan Strategies and Keating Research Healthier Colorado Voter Opinion Survey Topline Results-Black and African American Oversample

Magellan Strategies and Keating Research are pleased to present the topline results of a 1,008n online survey of Colorado voters who voted in the 2020 general election, with an oversample of 86 total Black/African American voters and an oversample of 236 total Hispanic voters. The interviews were conducted November 18<sup>th</sup> through December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

This survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.09% at the 95 percent confidence interval. The Black and African American oversample has a margin of error of +/- 10.57%. The Hispanic oversample has a margin of error of +/- 6.38%. This survey was weighted based upon 2020 Colorado general election voter turnout demographics. This survey was paid for by Healthier Colorado.

#### Survey Methodology

This interviews for this survey were completed by sending a text message to Colorado voters to take the survey online, as well as, conducting online interviews through an online panel. The survey response data was slightly weighted based upon Colorado 2020 general election voter turnout demographics. The interviews were conducted November 18<sup>th</sup> through December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. The overall survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.09% at the 95 percent confidence interval. The Black and African American oversample has a margin of error of +/- 10.57% at the 95 percent confidence interval. The Hispanic oversample has a margin of error of +/- 6.38% at the 95% confidence interval.
