Healthier Colorado 2026 Democratic Primary Survey Topline Results

Magellan Strategies is pleased to present the topline results of a survey of 697 registered Democrats and unaffiliated voters who are likely to vote in the 2026 Democratic Primary Election in the State of Colorado. The interviews were conducted from May 29 to June 3, 2025. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.71% at the 95 percent confidence interval. The survey data were weighted to represent the demographics of voter turnout in a midterm Democratic primary election in the State of Colorado.

T3. Being as descriptive as possible, please describe the most important issues and problems that you think the next Governor and the state legislature should be addressing.

- **Affordable Housing and Homelessness:** Overwhelmingly mentioned, including calls for more low-income housing, rent control, supportive services, and policies to address rising costs and homelessness across urban and rural areas.
- **Cost of Living and Economic Inequality:** Includes concern over inflation, wages not keeping up with expenses, food and utility costs, and economic policies benefiting the wealthy over working families.
- **Healthcare Access and Affordability:** Frequently cited issues include Medicaid/Medicare protection, mental health services, universal healthcare, rural hospital access, and prescription affordability.
- **Climate Change and Environmental Protection:** Many respondents stressed the urgency of addressing climate change, protecting water resources and public lands, and holding polluters accountable.

- **Education and School Funding:** Calls to increase investment in public K–12 education, higher education, teacher salaries, and school infrastructure were common.
- **Defense of Civil Rights and Democracy:** Strong concern about authoritarianism, federal overreach (especially under Trump), threats to LGBTQ+ rights, reproductive rights, and the rule of law.
- **Public Safety and Crime:** Concerns ranged from violent crime and drug addiction to traffic enforcement, police reform, and balanced approaches to law enforcement and social services.
- **Transportation and Infrastructure:** Multiple references to poor road conditions, underfunded infrastructure, public transit needs, and CDOT mismanagement.

This approach can enhance community safety by placing some offenders in juvenile detention and exposing them to the consequences of their actions early. Such intervention may deter them from future criminal behavior.

Unless a 10 or 11-year-old child has committed a serious offense like sexual assault or murder, they should be placed in counseling and therapeutic programs rather than being prosecuted. Evidence suggests that children who go through the criminal justice system at this age are much more likely to re-offend later in life. The interviews were conducted from May 29 to June 3, 2025. This survey has a margin of error of +/- 3.71% at the 95 percent confidence interval.
